Requirement for University Entrance:-

60 Level 3 credits with at least 14 from each of 3 approved subjects, plus Level 2 Literacy (5 credits in reading, 5 credits in writing), plus at least 10 Level 1 Numeracy credits

In Year 13 all students at Kavanagh College must take:-

- Religious Education
- plus **five (5) other options.**

Year 13 - Sixth Subject

All students in Year 13 are expected to study Religious studies and Five other subjects.

The Sixth Subject maybe:

- A full year traditional course
- A Semester course that may or may not include a supervised study
- Full year of supervised study

Semester Course Options

Semester courses will run Semester 1 (Term 1 & 2) or Semester 2 (Term 3). You may choose to do a Semester 1 Course and your Semester 2 Course could be a supervised study

Note – Remember you may choose courses across the levels (NCEA L1, L2 or L3) *if you meet the Entry Requirements.*
